BACKGROUND

The Asian and Pacific Training Centre for ICT for Development (APCICT/ESCAP), in partnership with the Ministry of Environment, Climate Change and Technology of Maldives, is organizing a **Maldives Academy Training on Information Security and Privacy** on 24-25 October 2022. The event is targeted to government officials from ICT ministries, telecommunication sector, regulatory authorities and related agencies in Maldives.

The training aims to deepen understanding among government officials and key stakeholders about information security and privacy concepts; the threats and challenges related to information security; importance of information security policies; requirements for establishment and implementation of policy on information security, including the life cycle of information security policy; and standards of information security and privacy protection in other countries and set by international information security organizations.



LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of the programme, participants are expected to:

- Define information security, privacy and related concepts;
- Identify threats to information security;
- Assess existing information security policy in terms of international standards of information security and privacy protection; and
- Formulate or make recommendations regarding information security policy that would be appropriate to their countries.
